2. **State of Vermont School Facility Analysis** – At this writing (March 3rd) I have not been notified that any of the CCSU schools are on the March schedule for visits by the AOE's consultant. If that changes, I will update you in the district meetings or by email.

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3. **US Dept of Energy “Renew American Schools” grant** – I received the decision letter on the Concept Paper I submitted in January. Our submission was “discouraged” which means we can go through the effort to apply but it seems unlikely we will get an award. The DOE received over 1000 concept papers in this first round. We will have an opportunity to apply again in FY24.
4. **PCB Testing** – Twinfield PCB results came in and were reported to the community. Peacham is scheduled for airborne testing on Mar 11-12. Cabot will have its second round of source testing in the gym that same weekend.

I testified on 2/28 at a combined session of the House and Senate Education committees on the proposed remediation funding formula. There is now some discussion in the Legislature of deferring additional PCB testing until after the full Facilities Study is completed. That change would take action by the General Assembly, and it is only speculation at this time. Any resulting delay will not stop the process in Cabot, Danville, Twinfield, and Peacham, and I have made it clear that whatever the Legislature decides, they can’t leave us hanging, and they still need to fund remediation work at 100%
